# **KEY STAGE 2**

#### Pupils should be taught to:

#### Listening

- Listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding
- Explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words.

## **Speaking**

- Engage in conversations; ask and answer questions, express opinions and respond to those of others; seek clarification and help.
- Speak in sentences using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures.
- Develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that others can understand when they are reading aloud or using familiar words and phrases.
- Present ideas and information orally to a range of audiences.

### Reading

- Read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing.
- Appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language.
- Broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced into familiar written material, including through using a dictionary.

## Writing

- Write phrases from memory and adapt these to create new sentences, to express ideas clearly.
- Describe people, places and things and actions orally and in writing.

#### Grammar

• Understand basic grammar appropriate to the language being studied, including (where relevant): feminine, masculine and neuter forms and the conjugation of high-frequency verbs, key features and patterns of the language; how to apply there, for instance, to build sentences; and how these differ from or are similar to English.
